David's Sermon Topic & Scripture

Ruth 1:19-22 "Can This Be Naomi?" Sunday Night: John 4, "Jesus & Outreach

<u>Discipleship</u>

Every church is called to make disciples. Our church is developing a clear plan of how we will do that, called a "discipleship process." Last week we looked at our community, the people we are trying to reach.

This week we will focus on small groups. Sunday School is the first small group we usually think of, but there are others in our church. We have a Tuesday night Bible study, Sunday evening discipleship training, and many more. "Small" is not simply a reference to the size of the group, but the function. Small groups are focused on relationships. In Bible studies, they allow for questions and discussion. People connect in a small group in a way that they can't through the Sunday morning worship service. People are much more likely to so something outside of the church with people they know from a small group.

This connection is important for several reasons. First, we grow spiritually when we are involved in each others' lives. Many of the commands in the New Testament talk about how to treat other church members, and they are difficult to practice without the relationships that small groups develop. "Care for one another," (1 Cor. 12:25), "Bear one another's burdens," (Gal. 6:2), "encourage one another daily," (Heb. 3:13), even "confess your sins to one another," (James 5:16), and many more.

Second, small groups really connect people to a church. One study showed that someone who is part of a small group is five times more likely to stay in a church than someone who is only attending Sunday morning. Anyone can come, sit in a pew, and observe a church service on a Sunday morning. But when you are connected to a group of people in a small group, you really begin to think, "This is my church."

Finally, many people come to the church through a small group. Perhaps intimidated by the large morning worship service, they are more likely to come to a small event when a friend invites them.

What our small groups need to do is take advantage of these advantages. Make sure you are focused on relationship building and reaching out to members of the community in your small group. Practice the "one anothers" with members of your group. Pray for God to use your group to help make disciples.
