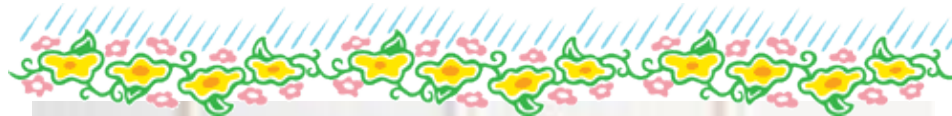

Discipleship:

Why celebrate the Passover?

Our Passover service will take place on Good Friday. On the year Jesus died, the Passover was on a Thursday evening. Because of the way the Jewish calendar works, Passover can fall on any day of the week. We will celebrate Passover on Friday because that is the day Passover occurs on the Jewish calendar this year. The Passover meal is also a wonderful way to commemorate the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus.

The first-century church always celebrated Passover in connection with remembering Jesus’ death and resurrection. Later, Christians began celebrating Jesus’ death and resurrection all on the same day. They called it “Passover,” but began to drop some of the Jewish traditions and biblical teaching surrounding Passover. By the fourth century, the church at Rome decided to begin celebrating Passover only on Sundays.

This celebration is still called Passover throughout much of the world to this day. In English, we call this day “Easter,” but in all other European languages Resurrection Day is known by words like “Pascuas,” (Spanish) which means, “Passover.”

Unfortunately, over the centuries Christians forgot many parts of the Passover meal that so clearly point to the work of Jesus in his death and resurrection. These parts of the celebration were intentionally left out and forgotten in order to create a separation between Jews and Christians. This separation led to centuries of lost opportunities to present the gospel to the Jewish people and created an environment where anti-Semitism could thrive.

Today, an increasing number of churches are reconnecting with the Jewish origins of the Christian faith through Passover celebrations. By learning about the Passover meal, Christians can understand the meaning of communion and the events of the “Last Supper.” When Jesus was preparing to eat this meal, he told his disciples, “I have eagerly desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer” (Lk. 22:15).

This Good Friday, we will observe the Passover, learn about the different traditions of the meal, and share in the Lord’s Supper together.
